Congratulations to Seb (Y6) who has recently passed Guitar Grade 1 with a 'Merit'.

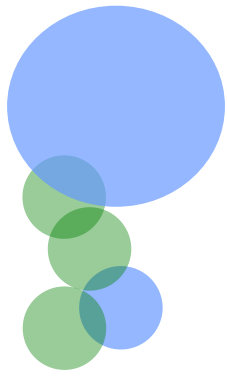

The children began their first day by creating passports, going through Passport Control, having special 'flights' to The Gambia courtesy of Year 6 - who made brilliant pilots and passport control officers - and Mrs Hann-Perkins for organising the flight visual effects!
