Thank you to our lovely volunteers who portrayed the 'On the road to Damascus' Story.

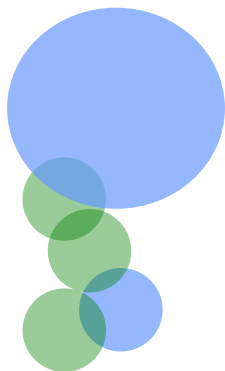


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## This/ Last week in School
