Marlborough 'Mop' Fairs

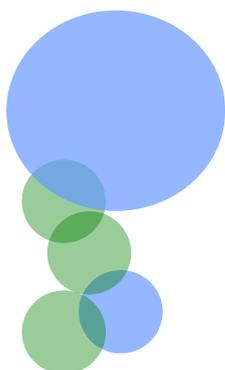
